### Facilities Referendum 2024: Why Now, and How Will It Impact the District?

I am honored to introduce myself as the new district administrator for the Mosinee School District. After spending over a decade serving as district administrator in Durand, and before that as middle/high school principal in Abbotsford, my family and I are thrilled to have joined this community. Over the past few months, we have experienced the warmth and kindness of the people here, and we deeply appreciate how welcome you've made us feel during this transition.

Taking on the role of district administrator is a responsibility I hold in the highest regard. In the coming months and years, I

am committed to earning your trust and respect by adhering to three core principles: transparency, hard work, and fiscal responsibility. These values are foundational to my leadership approach. My motto is simple: we will provide the best educational opportunities in the most fiscally responsible manner.

At the forefront of the district's agenda is the upcoming referendum. During the August Board of Education meeting, the board voted to pursue a \$19.75 million referendum to make vital additions and renovations to Mosinee High School. This project, which has a tax impact of \$0.17 per \$1,000 of property value, breaks down to \$17 per year for a home valued at \$100,000 or \$34 for a home valued at \$200,000.

This referendum is the result of a comprehensive process that began during the district's Strategic Planning initiative in the 2019-2020 school year, where improving district facilities was identified as a top priority. Since then, the district has successfully completed several projects, such as the high school science wing and the middle school cafeteria, without seeking referendum approval. However, the scope of the current project necessitates a referendum.

Last spring, we engaged the community through a survey to gather feedback on preferred projects and acceptable tax impacts. Based on those results, the district has developed a detailed list of proposed improvements, including expansions and renovations to the Career and Technical Education areas, a new safe and secure entrance, upgrades to technology infrastructure, a new commons and kitchen area, new locker rooms, and the conversion of vacated spaces into educational areas.

In the coming weeks, we will continue to provide detailed information regarding the referendum through various channels, including The Mosinee Times, the district website (https://www.mosineeschools.org/district/2024-facilities-referendum.cfm), social media, and Skylert. Additionally, a mailer will be sent to all district residents, and we invite you to attend an Open House on October 17th at 5:30 pm in the Creske Center Auditorium.

# A Successful Spring Sports Season for Mosinee Athletics

Last spring, Mosinee Softball competed in the 2024 WIAA State Softball Championship in Madison. In Game #1 against Lake Mills, Maggie Woller drove in a run for Mosinee on a sacrifice fly in the bottom of the seventh inning, advancing Amber Gonzalez for the game winner. The final score was 10-9.

In Game #2 versus Waupun, Mosinee struck first as Taelvn Jirschele found her way home in the first inning after a barrage of errors. Mosinee held



the lead until the 4th inning. The team had several base runners over the course of the game but could not string together the hits they needed and eventually lost in the D2 State Championship game 7-3, finishing as State Runners-up.



Mosinee Baseball beat La Crosse Logan in Game #1 in Appleton last spring. winning its first WIAA State game in school history. Mosinee scored six runs in the second and third innings, and provided all the runs needed with Garrett Shupe on the mound, as they cruised past La Crosse Logan 8-1. They then took on Edgewood in the 2024 WIAA State Baseball Division 2 Championship Game.

Mosinee jumped out to a 3-0 lead just three batters into their half of the first inning. After **Keagen Jirschele** reached base on an error to open the inning. he scored on Taylor Lemanski's RBI single. Gavin Obremski followed it up with a two-run home run for the three-run inning. Edgewood came back and went up 4-3 as Mosinee's pitch count climbed, sidelining Jirschele. Edgewood eventually won 12-6, however Mosinee still had its best finish to a season in program history.

Mosinee Track and Field had several athletes compete in the 2024 WIAA State Meet in La Crosse.

Madison Orlovsky, Katelyn Baars, Britt Fitzgerald, Taelyn Jirschele, Alannah Wolfgram, and Macie Hartle competed in the 1600M Relay: Britt Fitzgerald ran the 200M Dash; and Omar Ingram took third place in the Division 2 Boys High Jump!

### 2024 Facilities Referendum Financial Impact

If the \$19,750,000 referendum were approved by voters on November 5th, the estimated annual tax increase (over the current tax mill rate) would be \$0.17, representing \$17 for every \$100,000 of property value.

### ANNUAL ASBESTOS NOTICE AND INDOOR ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN ASBESTOS NOTICE certified management planner. Periodic surveillances are conduc

This notice is to inform the staff and students of the Mosinee School District that the Federal Environmental Protection Agency has amended the 1982 Asbestos Rule.

The 1982 rule required school districts to conduct an inspection of school buildings for all friable (easily crumbled with hand pressure) asbestos-containing materials and, if present, notify employees and parents of their existence. This rule placed no continuing responsibilities on the districts.

In 1987 the rule changed. Districts are now required to have their school buildings inspected by an accredited inspector for all friable and non-friable asbestos-containing building materials (ACBM), conduct reinspections, and develop a management plan for dealing with asbestos.

In 1988, the Mosinee School District contracted Twin City Testing Corporation of Wausau, Wisconsin, to inspect and develop a Management Plan for each building in the district. The Management Plan was submitted to the Wisconsin Department of Health and Social Services on October 12, 1988, as required by the new law.

The Management Plan had a mandatory implementation date of July 9, 1989. After that date, all asbestos-related work had to be conducted according to the Management Plan, unless altered by a

certified management planner. Periodic surveillances are conducted every six months to document the condition of asbestos-containing building materials.

All asbestos-containing building materials will be maintained with an operations and maintenance program, unless conditions warrant other action. Anyone interested in additional information about the location of asbestos containing building materials may contact the principal of the respective building or the district office to view a copy of the Management Plan for all district buildings.

### INDOOR ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

This notice is to inform staff and students of the Mosinee School District that, as directed by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, (2009 - Wisconsin Act 96) has adopted these standards.

The Mosinee School District will continue to give annual written notice to all parent and employee organizations about the availability of the Management Plan and any scheduled abatement activities.
