School Safety Top Priority for the Mosinee School District

Thank you to Mayor Jacobson and the entire Mosinee City Council for approving a preliminary budget including two additional school police officers as the Mosinee School District respectfully requested. The Mosinee School Board already approved substantial funding from the community service Fund 80 at the school district annual meeting to help offset the additional police expenses incurred by the city. If the preliminary budget is approved as presented by the city council, Mosinee School District school safety will have been increased dramatically in the unfortunate environment of regular school violence around the country. The Mosinee

School District has multiple sites and over 2000 students and staff present on any given day which is a little under half of the city population. Increasing the number of Mosinee Police Officers not only drastically increases the safety of the schools but the city as a whole. This entire process has been months in the works behind the scenes with special thanks to the entire ad hoc safety committee for the focused work. The school district will be working with Chief of Police Grams and City Administrator Gates to finalize the financial particulars and timeline as the city moves forward to what will hopefully be the final approval of the preliminary budget on November 28, 2022.

The Department of Justice Office of School Safety Director presented to the Mosinee School District ad hoc safety committee recently on many topics including but not limited to acquiring a complete safety assessment of our facilities and safety threat assessment training. The Mosinee School District is moving forward with the threat assessment training with the Office of School Safety and a complete safety assessment is scheduled. Both of these topics are proactive action steps to continue to prepare for situations that hopefully will never occur.

Safety fencing upgrades at the elementary school have been completed providing for a much more secure environment for our students during the day. The play facilities remain open to the public after the school day. Safety fencing upgrades at the middle school are nearing full completion. The middle school fencing upgrades are a few weeks behind the elementary school due to the need to coordinate with the construction workers finishing the new middle school cafeteria/commons. The high school will soon have a more secure limited-access entry similar to the middle school where access is temporarily delayed by a person directly at the point of entry.

School safety continues to be the top priority in the Mosinee School District, but is also the responsibility of the entire community. Staff and students practice safety drills regularly and are made aware of the need to speak up and say something if there seems to be a school safety risk, we encourage the community to do so as well. The school district's focus on mental health is directly related to school safety, as is our work on eliminating bullying. We continue to be thankful for a wonderful relationship with the City of Mosinee and specifically the Mosinee Police Department led by Chief Grams.

MHS Teacher Featured in DPI's CTE Success Stories



The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) has chosen to feature Mosinee technology and engineering instructor Zakary Kachel in their publication CTE Success Stories for his innovations in the classroom.

Kachel's philosophy is, "Connected to the community." Now a third-year teacher, the first change Kachel made was to start a woodworking club that students named Tech Club. The first project got club members involved in creating a sign for the local Mosinee Brewing Company. Built from the original flooring in the business, the job called on students to glue the floorboards to plywood and use the CNC router, among other hands-on steps, to create the sign. Students enjoyed the project so much that they came in during the summer to help finish it.

Mr. Kachel also started a SkillsUSA chapter at Mosinee High School. In the beginning, just Tech Club members joined, but after the thrill of competing in SkillsUSA, they quickly began recruiting friends to join as well.

All these additions and experiences have resulted in growing programs, which Kachel is pleased with since this creates skilled youth entering the community. Kachel says, "As long as we can stay committed to the passion that we all have for the kids and wanting to see them succeed, I don't think there's anything stopping [these programs] from growing leaps and bounds."

Fitzgerald Races in **State Cross Country Meet**


