## **Board Process of Selecting the Next Superintendent of Schools** on Target



As I reflect on the first quarter in the Mosinee School District as the interim superintendent, I am amazed at the impressive opportunities that our students have in the district to fully realize their academic and career pathway goals. I have had the opportunity to develop even stronger relationships with many teachers, administrators and faculty members and further experience this wonderful community. I am very blessed to be a part of this excellent school district.

Interim Superintendent of Schools On August 15th, 2023, the Mosinee School District Board of Education entered into an agreement with Hazard, Young, Attea & Associates (HYA) to have them conduct the search process for the next superintendent of the Mosinee School District.

At the heart of this search process were interviews and focus group meetings with students, staff, parents, and community members. These meetings were facilitated by HYA Associates during the months of September and October and were structured to gather input to assist the Board in determining the primary characteristics desired in the new superintendent. Additionally, the stakeholder interviews and focus groups collected information regarding the strengths of the Mosinee School District and some of the challenges we will be facing in the next few years. The groups held meetings to determine the criteria for selecting a new leader and the information is being used throughout the search to evaluate the candidates' qualifications. On October 24th, HYA Associates presented the findings of this Leadership Profile Assessment to the school board.

On November 7th, 2023, the Board of Education met with HYA Search Services Consultants to narrow the field down to six candidates that were brought in for the first round of interviews. The first round of interviews was conducted by the Board of Education on November 14th and November 15th. Following the interviews, finalists were selected by the Board and engaged with Mosinee School District faculty, staff, administrators, and community members, parents and students on December 4th.

By the end of December 2023, the superintendent's hiring will be board approved and announced. I will serve as the interim superintendent until June 30, 2024. The new superintendent will officially start on July 1st, 2024. At that time, I will resume my role as Director of Instructional Programs for the district.

#### **Swinick Promotes CTE at National Conference**

This November, Mosinee High School's School to Work Coordinator Mrs. Susan Swinick and Dr. Richard Cash of NRich Consulting collaborated on a presentation at the National Association for Gifted Children **Conference** in Orlando, FL. Their presentation "Promoting Talent Development: Lifting the Status of Career and Technical Education (CTE) Programming" focused on recognizing the high level skills required of students in CTE courses. Mrs. Swinick highlighted three of the School to Work programs and four Career to School organizations offered by the high school. These opportunities in CTE classes and clubs allow students to build leadership and technical skills, explore career pathways, and provide an outlet where their giftedness can flourish.



#### MHS Student Lighthouse Team

### **Mosinee School District's Artificial Intelligence Policy**

At the Mosinee School District, we are committed to fostering a culture of academic integrity and responsible use of technology.
