MHS Students Attend Honor Band Event

In November, the Mosinee High School Band had eight students, nominated by MHS Band Director **Tyler Schuster**, attend the annual **High School Honor Band** event hosted by **UW-Eau Claire**. 350 gifted musicians from 75 high schools across the Midwest gathered at UW-Eau Claire to learn from faculty, guest conductors, and students. They were divided into four different bands and rehearsed through the morning and afternoon. Students worked with **Dr. Charles Weise**, an adjunct music professor at Augsburg University; **Dr. Erika Svanoe**, composer and conductor at UW-Stout; and **Dr. John R. Stewart** and **Dr. Phillip Ostrander**, band directors at UW-Eau Claire. In the evening the four bands performed their finale concerts at the Pablo Center at the Confluence.






SkillsUSA District Contest
