The Mosinee School District successfully completed half a school year. I look back and give thanks for an outstanding end to 2023. Community members, along with local churches, banks and businesses, all generously provided gifts making the holiday season merrier for a total of 58 students as part of a gift-giving partnership that has existed for years. Thank you to our community sponsors for caring for our students. The 24 families were very grateful when they came to pick up the presents that were donated to their children.

Interim Superintendent of Schools The halls of our schools were filled with holiday activity. decorations and music throughout December. The music ensembles in both middle school and high school performed holiday concerts for the community. Also, the 2nd grade students performed their concert live for a full house in the Creske Center Auditorium. Feel free to stop in to use the pool, catch a show or join other Mosinee sports fans at an athletic event this winter. The Mosinee School District 2023-24 Budget includes a total tax levy of \$9,521,648 and state aid of \$14,612,638. The tax levy is distributed across the \$1,609,054,203 of equalized property of the nine (9) taxation districts making up the Mosinee School District. The resulting levy rate has decreased for a third consecutive year, at \$5.91, and results in a levy of \$591 per \$100,000 of property. The School Levy Tax credits provided by the State to taxation districts will further offset a portion of the tax levied by the school districts. The Mosinee School Board of Education interviewed three finalists in December for the superintendent position, but decided not to offer any of the three finalists the position. The vacancy has been reopened and will remain open until filled. The district is seeking additional applicants at this time.

At the December 19th board meeting, the Mosinee School Board approved the motion to partner with School Perceptions to develop a community survey to gather feedback on the future of district facilities and operations. School administration and the board are in the process of constructing questions for the survey. The survey will go out to all community members in the spring. Your input is appreciated.

At the January 8th City Common Council meeting, the city authorized a no parking area on the south side of High Street from 11th Street to 6th Street, 7:00 am - 4:00 pm during school days. The District Safety Ad Hoc Committee requested this change to improve the safety of traffic flow in this area. The new signage is scheduled to be installed in February. Parking is still available in the lot next to the high school front entrance.

Jason Shupe Receives Wisconsin Outstanding **Teacher Award**

Jason Shupe. a sixth grade math teacher at Mosinee Middle School. was honored by the State of Wisconsin with

Developmental Screening

The Mosinee School District is hosting "The Other Check-up" a free developmental screening on Friday, March 1, 2024 from 7:00am-12:00pm at Mosinee Elementary School, 600 12th Street. The event gives parents an opportunity to have their children, ages two years/nine months to five years, complete a screening of all areas of their development. Children will be asked to complete a variety of activities in the areas of motor skills, verbal skills, and cognitive/readiness skills. Parents need not have concerns to schedule a screening. Tax Levy and Rate

The Mosinee School District 2023-24 Budget includes State Aid of \$14,612,638 and a total tax levy of \$9,521,648. The levy is distributed to the nine (9) taxation districts within the Mosinee School District. The levy is distributed based on the property valuation of each taxation district as a percentage of the entire equalized property value of the District of \$1,609,054,203. Dividing the total levy by the equalized property values* results in a levy rate of \$5.91. A levy rate of \$5.91 would result in a tax of \$591 per \$100,000 of property. The tax levied by the District is then reduced on each tax bill by the school levy tax credit received by the taxation district from the State. In 2022-23 the taxation districts in the Mosinee School District received \$1,837,092 to offset the tax levy. The School Levy Tax credits were increased for 2023-24. It is estimated that Mosinee taxation districts will receive \$2,217,647 to offset the 2023-24 School District levy.

Open Enrollment Dates

February 5 - April 30, 2024

The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) has announced the dates for public school Open Enrollment for the 2024-25 school year. Children in kindergarten through grade 12 may participate. Open enrollment for prekindergarten, 4K and early childhood education is limited. Parents with children in these age groups must contact their resident school district to see if their children are eligible. If you would like your child to attend a different public school next year, you must apply to the school district of choice between February 5 and April 30, 2024. Applications must be received by 4:00 pm on April 30, 2024. Late applications will not be accepted. Parents may apply online at https://dpi.wi.gov/oe. 4K Registration Now Open For 2024-25 School Year

The enrollment process is now open for any students entering 4K (4-year-old kindergarten) for the 2024-25 school year. Children who are four years old on or before September 1, 2024 are eligible to register.
