Proactive Planning for Projected Budget Deficit Underway



regarding the budget challenges facing the Mosinee School District at this time. The Mosinee School District is facing a projected \$801,706 budget deficit for the 2024-25 school year based on current student enrollment projections. Therefore, the school board and administration are discussing budget reductions. The budget challenges are due to several factors that include: the WI state funding formula, declining enrollment and the discontinuation of ESSER (COVID relief) Grants.

I want to take the opportunity to share with you information

Interim Superintendent of Schools Administration has been in the process of reviewing suggested expense reductions. Included in this conversation is the development of the 2024-25 staffing plan which may include recommendations for staff reductions. Reducing our operational budget, although necessary, is difficult and painful. I am hopeful that we will find solutions that minimize the impact on our students.

Increasing our operational revenue will be necessary to avoid increasing budget challenges in the future. To that end, a district community survey, which will be finalized and shared with the community this spring, is being developed. The survey will gather information on public opinion for increasing revenue for district operations and/or capital improvements via a referendum vote.

This past month, the Mosinee School Board continued interviewing finalists for the superintendent position. Several finalists were introduced to staff, administration, students and community members on February 26th. The board will share more information once a final choice has been made, and the new superintendent will assume the duties July, 1 2024.

I would like to take this opportunity again to thank all families for their flexibility and patience on Thursday, February 1 as we worked through our emergency evacuation and family reunification. Student safety is our number one priority. The search efforts determined that all three school buildings were safe and no further threat exists.

A special thank you to Mosinee Police Chief Kenneth Grams and the Mosinee Police Department, and Father Becker and St. Paul Catholic Church. Thank you also to the agencies that responded to the Mosinee School District during this crucial time including: the Kronenwetter and University of Wisconsin-Madison Police Departments, the Marathon, Wood, Brown and Outagamie County Sheriff's Departments and the Wisconsin State Patrol.

Thank you to Mosinee administrators for their strong, calm leadership leading the evacuation and parent reunification. Thank you to all of our teachers and support and

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maintenance staff for their professionalism and taking great care of our students. Thank you to our students for being great citizens during this stressful time.

Finally, thank you to our School Board and amazing Mosinee community for all of the support and concern for students, faculty and administration. A special thank you to Lamers Bus Lines, Pit Stop, Lee's Piggly Wiggly, Gorski's, Casa Mezcal and many others. Your kindness is noticed and greatly appreciated.

In addition to the racks, the trio also made aesthetic improvements to create an inviting space ensuring a fun shopping experience for students. The walls were painted a soothing lilac, and an inspirational mural was painted on the back wall by MHS students Hannah Block, Natalie Block, Sierra Jonas, and Carmen Mielke. There is also artwork on the wall, along with a mirror and other decorative items around the room, making it a true boutique shopping experience!



Students can browse in Motique before, during, or after school to access any available resources they require. If a student does not want to be seen in the room, or needs items that are not available or they would need more of, they can scan the OR code on the Motique posters around the school to submit a Google form detailing what they need. The requested items are then delivered to students' lockers anonymously.



Motique accepts donations of new or gently used teen clothing, toiletries, hygiene products, and snacks. 
MES "Soup-er" Bowl Challenge

Open Enrollment Dates

February 5 - April 30, 2024

The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) has announced the dates for public school Open Enrollment for the 2024-25 school year. Children in kindergarten through grade 12 may participate. Open enrollment for prekindergarten, 4K and early childhood education is limited. Parents with children in these age groups must contact their resident school district to see if their children are eligible. If you would like your child to attend a different public school next year, you must apply to the school district of choice between February 5 and April 30, 2024. Applications must be received by 4:00 pm on April 30, 2024. Late applications will not be accepted. Parents may apply online at https://dpi.wi.gov/oe. 4K Registration Now Open For 2024-25 School Year

The enrollment process is now open for any students entering 4K (4-year-old kindergarten) for the 2024-25 school year. Children who are four years old on or before September 1, 2024 are eligible to register.

The 4K web page (https://www.mosineeschools.org/schools/4yok/) on the Mosinee School District website provides an overview of the 4K program and also step-by-step registration instructions. The first and most important step is registering your child in Mosinee's Skyward Family Access. Open enrollment and transportation forms can also be completed at this time. **The** 4K site preference form will open at noon on February 12, 2024.

2024-25 Kindergarten Registration

Students currently attending 4K in the Mosinee School District will automatically be enrolled in five-year-old kindergarten at Mosinee Elementary School for the 2024-25 school year. In early August, families will be emailed back-to-school information and their child's teacher information will be available in Skyward Family Access. If you know your child will not be attending Mosinee Elementary School for the 2024-25 school year, please call 715-693-2810 as soon as possible.
