Since June 2020, countless hours have been dedicated to maintaining, repairing, and updating the metals shop by Mosinee's Industrial Technology instructors **Ms. Kristie Heckendorf-Paul**, **Mr. Zakary Kachel** and **Mr. Bradley Oleson**. With the help of many local businesses and CWIMA, improvements in the manufacturing program have started to move forward allowing the staff to fully engage and train students.

In October 2021, Ms. Heckendorf-Paul applied for the **Wisconsin Fast Forward Technical Education Equipment Grant** and was recently notified that Mosinee was chosen to receive \$50,000. With this grant, the MHS Industrial Technology department will start updating the Machine Tool area, continuing their quest to move the shop out of the 1950s and into a highly rigorous manufacturing program relevant today.


