District funds balanced out the cost of the new addition. ## **Grants, Donations and Community** Support to Kick Off the School Year

Thank you Mosinee School District community for your continued support of our commitment to in-person learning with a mask-optional policy. COVID-19 remains a concern but with vaccines and treatments available, we have taken the approach of living with COVID-19 as we do with other illnesses in our society. The Mosinee School District continues to thrive as one of the best school districts in Marathon County. We are big enough to offer amazing opportunities, but small enough that we know your name. The pool, auditorium, and fitness center continue to be open for our community to enjoy. The Mosinee School District

continues to have a strong relationship with the City of Mosinee which helped forge the Safe Routes to School program resulting in the installation of flashing safety lights at the elementary school to improve awareness during high traffic periods.

The Mosinee School District received two large grants over the summer for a total of \$225,000. \$150,000 was received for school safety and another \$75,000 was received in a mental health grant. Both grants align well with our strategic plan pillar "Student and Staff Wellness." The district mental health navigator and district social worker both will be working with pupil services on the grant distribution.

The district financial position remains strong with over 30% fund balance, in excess of \$1.3 million dollars in a rainy-day capital improvement fund, up from under \$600 two years ago; fully funded post-employment health benefits for our year round staff; improved health insurance options; and Federal COVID ESSER dollars spent or targeted to be spent in excess of \$1.7 million dollars. There will be more detail in the next Link issue concerning the federal dollars. The district used this strong financial position to add teaching staff coming out of the global pandemic to support current and additional needs brought on by this once-in-a-lifetime challenge.

Special thanks for donations approaching \$50,000 from the Mosinee PTO, the Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin, and the B.A. & Esther Greenheck Foundation respectively which were used with district dollars to construct a handicap accessible play area behind Mosinee Elementary School. **Greenheck Fan Corporation** also generously constructed and donated 13 buddy benches for outdoor seating use. Thank you to the Mosinee Community Athletic **Association** for installing a parking lot on school district fields off of Rangeline Road. This is a wonderful addition to our district facilities paid for with private funds but used by many in the district and larger community.

Mosinee Homecoming 2021 filled the last week of September with dress up days, trophy competitions, and powder puff football. The amazing Mosinee Homecoming parade and football game takes place Friday, October 1 and the Homecoming dance for students will be on Saturday, October 2. Our fall sports fill the evenings and weekends with activity - feel free to stop out. It's always a great time to be in the Mosinee School District but a little more so during Homecoming Week!

years following, MMS has added a 10 spin mondo (merry go round for 10), a standup teeter totter, floor hockey





## **Mosinee Schools Welcome New Mental Health Navigator**



The Mosinee School District values the socialemotional and mental health and well-being of all students and families and is excited to introduce Kurstin Kolodziei as the district's new mental health navigator. Mrs. Kolodziej will be working with building principals, school counselors and psychologists, the school social worker, and community service providers to build healthy relationships within Mosinee schools.

The district strives to provide students with a solid social-emotional curriculum, to implement positive behavioral interventions and supports (PBIS), and to connect students and families with school and community based resources. In addition to these policies, Mrs. Kolodziej will be organizing, developing, and leading professional development/learning activities for staff; helping staff, students, and families understand how to access mental health and social emotional supports; collaborating with community mental health providers to arrange opportunities for students to access mental health services while at school; providing resources, training, and information for staff, students, and families to increase their understanding of mental health and social-emotional development; supporting the use of social-emotional lessons and learning materials for students through collaboration with school counselors, teachers, and administrators; and managing and monitoring mental health grants which provide funds to support mental health and social-emotional development.

Mrs. Kolodziej graduated from UWSP in 2004 with a major in early childhood education and a minor in early childhood special education. She received her masters degree in 2018 in educational administration from Concordia University, WI. Prior to her role in Mosinee, she was an early childhood special education teacher and an early childhood program support teacher in the Wausau School District.

#### ANNUAL ASBESTOS NOTICE AND INDOOR ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

ASBESTOS NOTICE

This notice is to inform the staff and students of the Mosinee School District that the Federal Environmental Protection Agency has amended the 1982 Asbestos Rule.

The 1982 rule required school districts to conduct an inspection of school buildings for all friable (easily crumbled with hand pressure) asbestoscontaining materials and, if present, notify employees and parents of their existence. This rule placed no continuing responsibilities on the districts.

In 1987 the rule changed. Districts are now required to have their school buildings inspected by an accredited inspector for all friable and non-friable asbestos-containing building materials (ACBM), conduct reinspections, and develop a management plan for dealing with asbestos.

In 1988, the Mosinee School District contracted Twin City Testing

Corporation of Wausau, Wisconsin, to inspect and develop a Management Plan for each building in the district. The Management Plan was submitted to the Wisconsin Department of Health and Social Services on October 12, 1988, as required by the new law.

The Management Plan had a mandatory implementation date of July 9. 1989. After that date, all asbestos-related work had to be conducted according to the Management Plan, unless altered by a certified management planner. Periodic surveillances are conducted every six months to document the condition of asbestos-containing building materials.

All asbestos-containing building materials will be maintained with an operations and maintenance program, unless conditions warrant other action. Anyone interested in additional information about the location of asbestos containing building materials may contact the principal of the respective building or the district office to view a copy of the Management Plan for all district buildings.

#### INDOOR ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

This notice is to inform staff and students of the Mosinee School District that, as directed by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, (2009 - Wisconsin Act 96) has adopted these standards.

The Mosinee School District will continue to give annual written notice to all parent and employee organizations about the availability of the Management Plan and any scheduled abatement activities.
