The beginning of the 2022-2023 school year filled the days and nights with activities for students, staff, and families, including open houses held at all three schools to help ease the transition of returning to the classroom. The energy and high-activity that accompanied the start of school carried through to the fun-filled environment that always comes with Homecoming, highlighted this year with a cinema theme including an Adam Sandler dress up day. Special thank you to all staff for providing a wonderful start of school for our students, staff, and parents.

We continue to be appreciative of all of the comments and feedback provided by community members at our most recent school board meetings. The Mosinee School Board and I will work in collaboration with district administrators and staff to review information that has been provided. We are committed to a continuous improvement process in all respects including but not limited to student learning and achievement, staff development and retention, and sound fiscal responsibility. Special thank you to our entire staff for their dedication and commitment to students, staff and the community as a whole going above and beyond during one of the most difficult times to teach in education.

School safety continues to be a focus for the school district. The school board recently created an Ad Hoc Safety Committee that made great strides over the summer taking a deep dive into school district safety. They implemented immediate changes including new fencing, a new high school secure entrance, and a new Raptor Technologies® identification entry system. These changes should be operational during the first quarter. We continue to discuss options with the City of Mosinee concerning our school resource officer contract and any improvements we may be able to collaboratively provide.

The Middle School Addition/Remodel is progressing nicely. The masons are in full work mode with several walls up but, most importantly, the connection between this new facility and the Creske Gym is complete. The new Middle School Cafeteria/ Commons is Phase 1 of the project to be followed by remodeling the existing cafeteria for special education and pupil services staff. We are tentatively planning completion of Phase 1 by Christmas 2022. By the end of the summer of 2023, all aspects of this project will have been completed including new 8th grade classrooms, new middle school choir practice areas, and a new middle school choir room.

The Mosinee School District and the YMCA have found common ground in attempting to provide more services to our local residents before, during, and after school hours. The first step was the YMCA adding a director position that will be housed in our buildings. Ben Wisniewski, the former Mosinee Pool Manager, has been hired to fill this role and we are all excited to have Ben back. We look forward to our future expanded community offerings working together with the YMCA.

Creske Library Updated to Serve Grades 4-12

The Creske Library, formerly known as the Mosinee High School IMC, is now serving both middle school and high school students after it was decided in January to move the 4-8 library out of the 1922 wing of the middle school and combine it with the high school IMC.



The process began in March when new carpet was installed, replacing the original blue carpet from 1996. During the summer, new tables and chairs were added along with soft, purple rocking chairs to provide flexible seating. The finishing touch was converting the library conference room into a classroom for the daily 4th and 5th grade classes. The classroom is also available to any other class visiting the library that needs space for a large group to meet.

Grades 4-12 have been using the library since the first day of school and are enjoying the new seating and new classroom arrangement.

ANNUAL ASBESTOS NOTICE AND INDOOR ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN ASBESTOS NOTICE certified management planner. Periodic surveillances are conduc

This notice is to inform the staff and students of the Mosinee School District that the Federal Environmental Protection Agency has amended the 1982 Asbestos Rule.

The 1982 rule required school districts to conduct an inspection of school buildings for all friable (easily crumbled with hand pressure) asbestos-containing materials and, if present, notify employees and parents of their existence. This rule placed no continuing responsibilities on the districts.

In 1987 the rule changed. Districts are now required to have their school buildings inspected by an accredited inspector for all friable and non-friable asbestos-containing building materials (ACBM), conduct reinspections, and develop a management plan for dealing with asbestos.

In 1988, the Mosinee School District contracted Twin City Testing Corporation of Wausau, Wisconsin, to inspect and develop a Management Plan for each building in the district. The Management Plan was submitted to the Wisconsin Department of Health and Social Services on October 12, 1988, as required by the new law.

The Management Plan had a mandatory implementation date of July 9, 1989. After that date, all asbestos-related work had to be conducted according to the Management Plan, unless altered by a

certified management planner. Periodic surveillances are conducted every six months to document the condition of asbestos-containing building materials.

All asbestos-containing building materials will be maintained with an operations and maintenance program, unless conditions warrant other action. Anyone interested in additional information about the location of asbestos containing building materials may contact the principal of the respective building or the district office to view a copy of the Management Plan for all district buildings.

INDOOR ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

This notice is to inform staff and students of the Mosinee School District that, as directed by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, (2009 - Wisconsin Act 96) has adopted these standards.

The Mosinee School District will continue to give annual written notice to all parent and employee organizations about the availability of the Management Plan and any scheduled abatement activities.
