3. **Approval of the minutes from October 3, 2016 meeting** motion to approve by K. Maier, second by S. Kaczor. Motion approved.

New Business

4. **Extended Field Trip Requests**
 - a. **Six Flags--Gurnee IL.** MHS Advanced Placement® Physics - Matt Lindsey has submitted a request to travel to Six Flags Great America, for physic day. Students will explore and collect data relative to Newton's Laws of Motion as they are applied to the rides and events. Students will have activities for data collection, analysis, and graphical representation of data. Students will take a bus and will pay for their own fees. Trip is planned for May 25, 2017. Motion to approve by P. Nievinski, second by K. Maier. Motion approved.
 - b. **National FFA Convention--Indianapolis IN.** MHS FFA, Brittany Babik has submitted a request to travel to the FFA Convention, this request is for the 2017-2018 school year, they will depart on October 25, 2017 and will return October 28, 2017. FFA has gone on this trip for the last 15-20 years. There is no cost to the district for this trip. Motion to approve by P. Nievinski, second by C. Zastrow. Motion Approved.
 - c. **MN Zoo and Rodeo--MHS FFA -** Brittany Babik has submitted a request to travel to Minneapolis, MN to take students to the Raptor Education Center at the Minneapolis Zoo and the the attend the World's Toughest Rodeo as an incentive for students who participated in the FFA fruit sale. Approximately 50 students will attend, there is no cost to the district and the trip will take place Saturday,

February 5, 2017, and students will return Sunday, February 6, 2017. Motion to approve by P. Nievinski, second by S. Kaczor. Motion approved.

5. New Course Proposals

- a. Advanced Art - Katherine Marotz- After reviewing the current Individualized Art class Marotz is recommending replacing the class with Advanced Art. Switching to Advanced Art would provide more structure and would serve as a prerequisite course for Advanced Placement® Studio Art. There will not be any increase to the district cost for this course. Right now we have about 11 students in individualized Art. Motion to approve by P. Nievinski, second by A. Makela. Motion approved.
- b. Advanced Placement® Studio Art - Katherine Marotz has submitted a proposal to include Advanced Placement® Studio Art. Students will be eligible for college credits with this course. Students would create and submit a portfolio of their work to be judged. This course would teach students how to photo their art and submit it into different contests.No financial cost to district. Motion to approve P. Nievinski, second by K. Maier. Motion approved.
- c. Advanced Yoga - Danelle Ley has submitted a request to offer a second level of yoga. There would be no additional costs or FTE needed to add this course. It is possible that the current aerobics course may be dropped due to a lack of student interest. Yoga enrollment has increased with current students expressing an interest in the opportunity to take additional coursework in yoga. Motion to approve P. Nievinski, second by K. Maier. Motion approved.
- d. Education and Training Career Cluster Internship - The Career and Technical Education Department has worked with Denny Flathom to outline and propose a course related to the Education and training Career Cluster. The proposed course would more clearly define the roles and expectations for our faculty and students. This would be for 11th and 12th grade students. Their duties would include but not be limited to help teachers with tasks and be trained by the teachers to help them. This course fits into the Education and Training Career Cluster (one of sixteen career clusters designated by the technical college system). Students may utilize this course toward the Youth Leadership Certificate issued by the Department of Public Instruction. To fulfill the Certificate requirements students would need to document a minimum of 90 hours of work (their school experience as well as experience outside of school) and successfully complete additional tasks as defined by the rubric. Motion to approve P. Nievinski, second by C. Zastrow. Motion approved.

6. Pupil Nondiscrimination Self Review - A draft of the 5-year Pupil Nondiscrimination Review was given to the committee. This will be finalized at the December Curriculum and Standards meeting.
