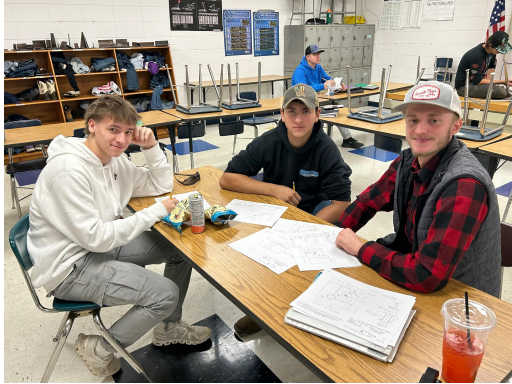

Dual Credit

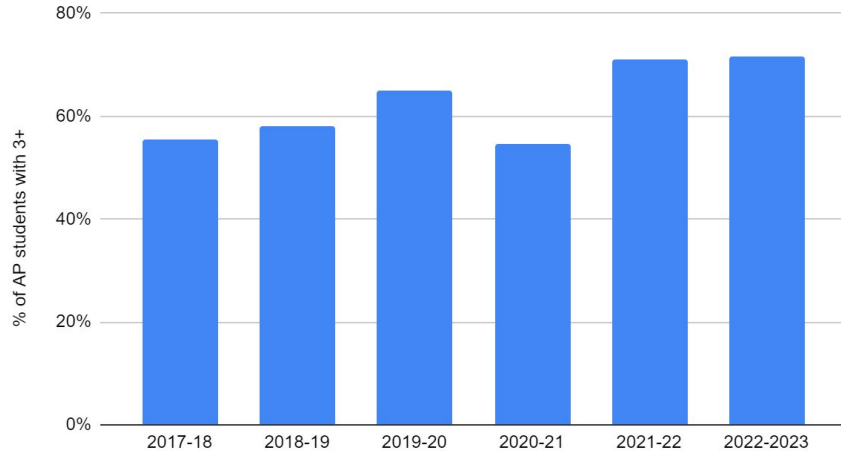
Our partnership with NTC leads to the highest number of tuition credits attempted, and the highest tuition value in the region, saving students and families money and helping them with their college and career aspirations.

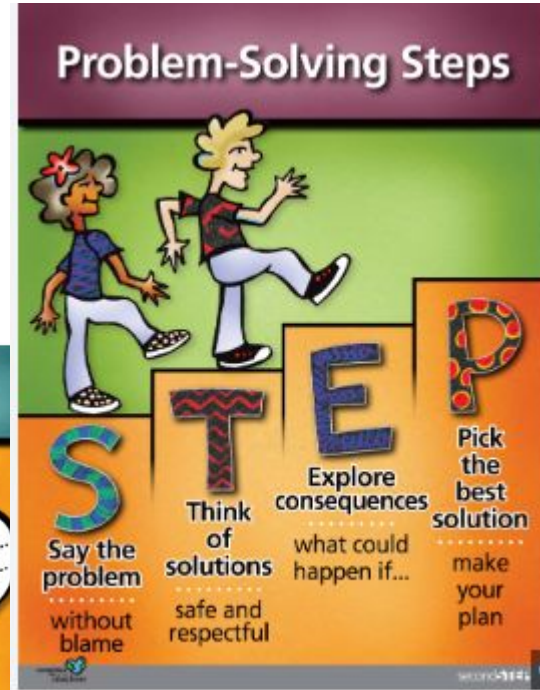
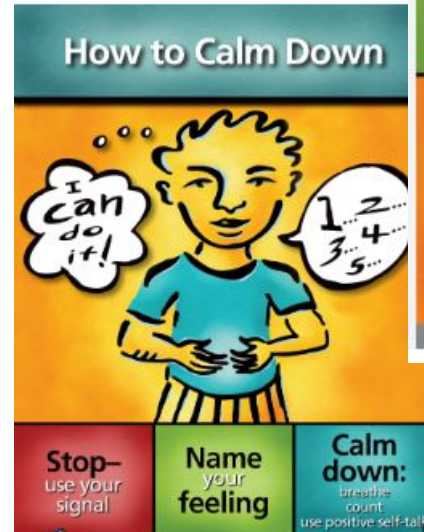

Peer Mentorship Groups
