




#### **Survey Information**




#### Is your primary residence in the District?







#### In which municipality do you live?









#### Do you have children attending a school in the District?

#### **Funding to Support Operations**

The District developed the following operational referendum options for community feedback:

Option 1: If voters support a referendum providing \$2.05 million per year, the District would be able to maintain most programs and services.

Option 1 would increase taxes over current levels by approximately \$126 for every \$100,000 of property value for each of the next four years.

Option 2: If voters support a referendum providing \$2.95 million per year, the District would be able to maintain all programs and services, increase building maintenance funds, and update math and reading class materials.

Option 2 would increase taxes over current levels by approximately \$180 for every \$100,000 of property value for each of the next four years.

Option 3: If voters support a referendum providing \$3.7 million per year, the District would be able to pay for everything in Options 1 and 2 and help offset estimated increasing costs due to inflation.


Option 3 would increase taxes over current levels by approximately \$226 for every \$100,000 of property value for each of the next four years.

If voters do not support any referendum, the District would need to cut approximately \$2.05 million in staffing (resulting in larger class sizes), programs, and services per year from the operating budget. This would begin in the 2025-26 school year.






## Which operational referendum amount would you support?







#### Additional Analysis: Operational Referendum Support



#### Weighted support:

**Option 2:** 0.25 (59%) + 0.75 (34%) = **40.3%** 

**Option 1:** 0.25 (72%) + 0.75 (45%) = 51.8%

**Smaller:** 0.25 (79%) + 0.75 (58%) = **63.3%** 





#### **Facility Projects**

#### **High School Kitchen and Cafeteria** (Estimated cost: \$10.9 million)

This project would:

- ✓ Build a new high school kitchen and cafeteria.
- ✓ Remodel the existing kitchen and cafeteria into a possible community fitness center.

#### **Secured Entrance/High School Office/District Office/Early Learning Center** (*Estimated cost: \$2.4 million*) This project would:

- ✓ Build a new high school office with secured entrances to better monitor/control access.
- ✓ Move the District Office to the previous high school office location.
- ✓ Create the potential for an early learning center with a secured entrance in the building where the District Office was located.

#### **Career and Technical Education** (Estimated cost: \$7.9 million)

This project would:

- ✓ Update and expand the current metal fabrication classroom and lab areas.
- ✓ Build a new woodworking classroom and lab area.
- ✓ Add an automotives classroom and lab area.





#### **Facility Projects**

**Technology Infrastructure** (Estimated cost: \$1.3 million)

This project would:

- ✓ Update our servers.
- ✓ Replace our fiber and connectivity systems.

**Locker Rooms and Classrooms** (Estimated cost: \$4.3 million)

This project would:

- ✓ Build new boys and girls locker rooms.
- ✓ Remodel the current locker rooms into classrooms and learning areas.

**Gym** (Estimated cost: \$11.2 million)

This project would:


- ✓ Add a gym to better meet the school and community programming needs.
- ✓ Provide additional space that can serve as a community shelter as needed. (The District is applying for FEMA funding to help with the cost.)





#### Facility Project Support

Priority score is calculated based on High = 3, Medium = 2, Low = 1







#### **Funding Support**


To fund any of the potential facility projects, the District would need to pursue a <u>capital referendum</u>. This type of referendum allows Mosinee to take out a loan (issue debt) to pay for major facility improvements. Approval requires majority support from local voters.


### Capital referendum funding support







#### Additional Analysis: Capital Referendum Support



#### Weighted support:

**\$30M:** 0.25 (52%) + 0.75 (28%) = **34%** 

**\$22M:** 0.25 (68%) + 0.75 (43%) = **49.3%** 

**\$14M:** 0.25 (75%) + 0.75 (55%) = 60.0%



#### What did we learn?

- An operational referendum of \$2.05 million is within the margin of error.
  - A smaller operational referendum would likely be supported if the election were held today.
- A \$14 million capital referendum would likely be supported if the election were held today.
  - A \$22 million capital referendum is within the margin of error, indicating the District could consider a capital referendum between \$14 and \$22 million.
