Less than 10% absenteeism is a predictor of 3rd grade reading success.

Percent of students in grades K-3 with full day attendance rate of 90% or higher.

Reading Readiness

Third grade literacy is correlated with reading and English language arts (ELA) proficiency on state assessment at the middle grades level.

Self Regulation

Children's self-regulation skills – the ability to maintain engaged focus, stay on task, inhibit inappropriate behaviors and delay gratification – predicts later school success

Math Readiness

Preschool math skills support first-grade math skills, which support fifth-grade math knowledge.

Wisconsin Forward Exam
